Polite Reminders

As we all return on Monday, 8th March, parents are politely reminded:

- Attendance by all children is <u>compulsory</u>. Any nonattendance will be recorded as absent and treated in line with the School Attendance & Punctuality Policy.
- As numbers of children and parents on site will significantly increase from Monday onwards, we must insist on the use of the one-way system when dropping off and collecting your child. Please do not be offended if you are asked to go back and use the oneway system. Please also limit the number of adults accompanying children to one where at all possible.
- Snacks brought from home for break time should only be fruit, toast or crumpet. You are now able to order morning snacks on ParentPay up until 8 am on the day. Please do not send your child with chocolate, crisps or breakfast bars for break time snack. If these items have been included in your child's packed lunch, please remind them that they should not be eating these items at break time.
- In line with the School Uniform Policy, please note that long hair should be tied up, with plain ribbons, bobbles. No large colourful hair adornments. No extreme haircuts ie, shaved head, tramlines.
- We require all children to wear appropriate black school shoes. Boots, trainers or high-heeled shoes are not considered appropriate footwear for school. However, we do understand that children may have grown out of their school shoes and it is difficult to get new ones with shops closed. Until non-essential shops re-open, please do not worry if your child needs to attend in school in alternative footwear.
