## Welcome to an exciting new school year!



## Pre-school News

This half term we have lots of exciting things happening in Pre-School! We will especially be focusing upon developing children's skills in the prime areas of Physical development, Personal,



Each week One of our Class friends will be sent home with a child with a notebook for your child to draw a picture, add a photograph and for you to write a bit about the weekend adventures. Please return with your child at their first session the following week for the children to talk about. Please be aware that any photographs that you add to the book will be seen by other classmates and their families.

As we embrace the autumn we will be exploring the changes of this season. As part of this theme, during the week of 18th October the children will also be invited to come dressed in autumn colours

for our Planet Protectors Day as we investigate autumn changes outdoors!



We are having a Teddy Bears' Picnic Tuesday 14th September (pm). The children will need to bring a teddy bear or cuddly friend to join them on their adventure!

We have some exciting trips around the local area (subject to COVID guidance) starting with our library trip on the 22nd September in the afternoon, to choose a book to bring home. As soon as we have confirmed dates for the other trips we will let you know, and if you are available to attend as a parent helper please let us know. Mrs Cooper will be sending out the form for completion children who attend on a Wednesday afternoon to receive a library card; please could you return this to us by 14th September to allow plenty of time for the library to process the forms. We are also hoping to go on a trip to explore local surroundings on 6th October in the afternoon.

Please could you send your child with at least one named change of clothes and a waterproof coat along with a pair of welly boots ready to enjoy the fun outdoor, activities we have planned this half term in all weathers. We always have outside play available and will often go on a phonics walk, or a welly walk to name a few as we explore the school grounds.

## Reception Class News

As we start our wonderful new learning journey and build up friendships in Reception, the children will be learning our Golden Rules: 'Be a good friend'; 'Share'; 'Have kind hands'; 'Have a kind mouth'; and 'Work together'. We will be discussing how to be a good friend, and exploring feelings and emotions through stories, circle times, games and our Golden Rules.



Show and Tell In our second week we will introduce Show and Tell every week. This is a favourite activity in Reception class and it supports children's language and communica-

tion brilliantly! By the end of their first week children will bring home details of their Show and Tell group and the day that they will have Show and Tell each week. Please could your child bring in one item each week, ensuring: it is small enough to fit in their school tray; it is not an expensive or precious item; it is not an item which can take photos. video or accesses the internet. Our theme for this half term is 'My favourite toy'!

In Reception class we are Maths Ninjas! We will be learning all about numbers 0-5, exploring each number in depth, including recognising these numbers, learning number formation rhymes to support writing numbers, matching numerals to quantities, being involved in fun and practical maths challenges, and learning to subitise small groups of objects!

We will be complimenting the reading opportunities that your child has at home through daily story time sessions including fiction and nonfiction books, poems, traditional tales and more! The Bible story of Creation is one of the stories we will be learning in more depth; we will be exploring songs and art linked to the story.

Children will have reading logs and reading books to take home from Reception class within the first two weeks of starting school. Further information about reading books, reading at home and guided reading in school will be included in the front cover of your child's reading log. We are very excited to be introducing Monster Phonics in St Joseph's! We will soon send details regarding a parents Monster Phonics Webinar where you can learn all about this fantastic, fun phonics program and find out about how you can support your child at home. Please look out for these details in the school newsletter.

In order to support children's early writing skills we will be practising using an effective pencil grip and good writing posture in reception class. This month children will be practising writing their names and will also soon begin daily handwriting practice!

Other exciting learning includes the children being involved in a super sneezing experiment as we learn about the 'Catch it, Bin it' rule, and how to be 'Handwashing Heroes'! In PE we will be having fun and exploring football skills including dribbling and passing. This half term we will be reading Tom and the lost island of dinosaurs' by Ian Beck and receiving a mystery parcel!!! I wonder what will be in there?!!!!
